So much of what Jesus spoke about was living in right relationships: with God; and with one another. Rather than simply being a 'back-up group' for Jesus, the disciples provided a lived example of trying to live in right relationships. They didn't always get it right, but they were on the way. Reflecting on today's Gospel, Pope Francis points out that Jesus responds to his disciples' question in an interesting way. Asked where he lives, Jesus does not name a place or give directions. 'Come and see,' is the simple answer he offers. 'Not a calling card,' the Pope points out, 'but an invitation to an encounter'.

Then, the Pope reminds us, something real happened. The disciples went with Jesus and spent the remainder of the day with him. Decades later, when the Gospel was written, someone made a point of noting the hour. As the Pope says, 'this is one thing that makes us think: every authentic encounter with Jesus remains alive in memory; it is never forgotten.'

We might extend the Pope's point to note the way that Peter is named 'Cephas' (rock) the very next morning. Not only was there another memorable realness to the encounter, but there is an earthiness in Jesus' choice of name. Perhaps initially a slightly ironic nickname (remember the cock crowing!), ultimately Peter becomes part of the Church's bedrock. Now, centuries later, Pope Francis reminds us to be like the Apostles: open to memorable encounters.

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
